- -Confession: One hour before the Divine Liturgy. At other times by appointment.
- -First Holy Communion: Celebrated publicly once a year. Please contact Father Fadi to sign up for classes.

- **-Communion of the Sick:** Please let us know when a loved one is sick, hospitalized, or homebound.
- **-Last rites**: Please let us know immediately when a loved one is gravely ill and in danger of death. Be sure to provide for the spiritual needs of your loved ones.
- **-Mass intentions:** If you would like to have a Mass offered for your intentions or the intentions of a loved one, living or deceased, please contact the Pastor before two weeks at least.

Why fasting?

Catholic believers fast as a spiritual practice to grow closer to God. Fasting is an ancient tradition in the Church, rooted in both Scripture and the teachings of Jesus. There are several reasons why Catholics fast:

1. Spiritual Discipline

Fasting helps Catholics exercise self-control and discipline. It's a way to detach from worldly comforts and focus on the soul's relationship with God.

2. Repentance and Penance

Fasting is often associated with repentance for sins. Catholics fast as a form of penance, expressing sorrow for their sins and seeking God's mercy.

3. Following Jesus' Example

Jesus fasted for 40 days in the desert before beginning His public ministry (Matthew 4:1-11). Catholics imitate His example, especially during Lent.

4. Preparation for Prayer and Worship:

Fasting helps clear the mind and heart, making it easier to pray and listen to God. It prepares Catholics spiritually for important feasts, like Easter.

5. Solidarity with the Poor:

By giving up food or other comforts, Catholics remember those who are hungry and in need. Fasting can inspire acts of charity and compassion.

6. Offering Sacrifice:

Fasting is a small sacrifice offered to God out of love and gratitude. It's a reminder that God is the source of all good things.

- Fridays in Lent: Catholics abstain from meat as a form of fasting.
- Optional Personal Fasting: Many Catholics fast or give up certain foods or activities as a personal spiritual practice.

Fasting is not just about food—it's about turning the heart toward God. It's a reminder that spiritual nourishment is more important than physical comfort.



Spiritual Retreat at Our Church


Join us March 28-30 for a transformative spiritual retreat led by Father Dominic Hanna!

Parish Hall Update:

In February, the Financial and Building Committees convened to evaluate the feasibility study for the parish hall adjacent to the church. Collaborating with Mr. Badwi, they revised the proposed plans and explored potential fundraising initiatives to finance the construction and associated costs. Mr. Tony Tabshe, the engineer, attended to answer any questions related to the study. It was concluded that the hall needs to be elevated by more than four feet and should have the capacity to hold 200 people.

Furthermore, the Saint Charbel House will be demolished to create a parking area. The committee also decided to keep the Lutz property for possible future use. The feasibility study will be submitted to the Chancery and the Bishop for review at the earliest opportunity.

Please note: No decisions have been finalized; all options are still being considered.


