

Baptism: By appointment, one parent and one sponsor must be practicing Catholics

The Transformative Power of Baptism.

Baptism is the sacrament in which believers are "reborn as sons of God" (CCC 1213) by "water and Spirit" (John 3:5). It incorporates us into the Mystical Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:13) and makes us sharers in the mission of the Church (CCC 1213).

"Just as the gestation of our first birth took place in water," the Catechism adds, "so the water of baptism truly signifies that our birth into the divine life is given to us in the Holy Spirit" (694).

This divine life in the Spirit, also known as sanctifying grace, is the reason why St. Peter can say in 2 Peter 1:4 that in Christ we become "partakers of the divine nature."

"New birth in the Holy Spirit" (CCC 1262) is not the only effect of baptism. There is also purification from sins. In baptism, all our sins are forgiven, along with all temporal punishment due for sin. The purification that takes place in baptism is so complete that in those who have just received it, "nothing remains that would impede their entry into the kingdom of God; neither Adam's sin, nor personal sin, nor the consequences of sin, the gravest of which is separation from God" (1263).

These two principal effects of baptism—new birth in the Spirit and purification from sins—is brought about within the soul by the gift of sanctifying grace, also called "the grace of justification" (1266), that the Holy Spirit infuses in baptism (2024). Sanctifying grace is the healing gift of God's life that makes us holy and pleasing to him. In the words of St. Paul, sanctifying grace makes us "a new creation" (2 Cor. 5:17).

To make the occasion even sweeter, we'll be serving traditional Lebanese pastries.


Please bring your own bottle of water to be blessed during the ceremony.

May the joy and peace of the Christmas season fill your heart and guide you throughout the year.






